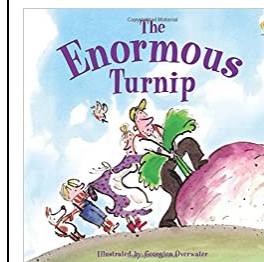
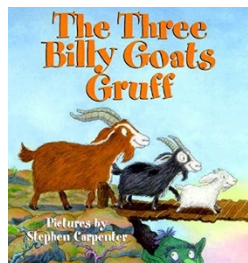


Nursery - Summer 1 - Traditional Tales



	Communication and Language	Physical Development	Personal, Social and Emotional Development
Prime Areas	<p>This half term, the children will practise retelling familiar tales with increasing confidence. They will use story maps to help them develop and use key story language and new vocabulary.</p> <p>We will also regularly use our Colourful Semantics scheme to build longer sentences with increasing amounts of information.</p>	<p>This half term, the children will be working to develop their team skills. We will be taking part in a range of team games and activities and working together. We will also be choosing ways to move around different large and small obstacles during our PE lessons and using different equipment like push bikes and scooters to develop our movements.</p>	<p>This half term, we will develop the children's feeling of responsibility within the school community. We will be giving Nursery children different jobs and responsibilities around the classroom. The children will develop their use of voice to be assertive in different situations when it is required of them.</p>

Specific Areas	<p>During our Traditional Tales topic, we will mainly be looking at <i>The Three Billy Goats Gruff</i> and <i>The Enormous Turnip</i>. We will practise these stories daily to help us be able to retell the stories independently.</p> <p>We will also be writing our names and lists, thinking of words to describe an ogre, using phase 2 sounds that we will have learned in our daily phonics lessons.</p>	<p>This half term, we will continue our learning about measurement. We will use comparative language to talk about measuring length and capacity.</p> <p>We will also be learning about patterns. We will describe familiar patterns around us as well as making and continuing simple repeating patterns.</p> <p>Finally, we will be using sequencing language to describe events within Nursery.</p>	<p>During our topic of Traditional Tales, we will be thinking about the structure of tales, heroes and villains, We will talk about the <i>Enormous Turnip</i>, where it comes from and how it grows.</p> <p>We will also be experimenting with different materials and textures to make a strong bridge for the three billy goats gruff to travel across, comparing materials and exploring different forces.</p>	<p>In Nursery, the children will take part in lots of role play and small world play about the stories they have been focussing on.</p> <p>The children will be drawing characters from traditional tales, thinking about the details that they need to include.</p> <p>We will also learn a range of nursery rhymes and songs about familiar traditional tales.</p>
